PLEASE FAMILIARISE YOURSELF WITH THE SHOW RULES:

- All exhibits in Flowers, Fruit and Vegetables to be grown by the exhibitor. Exhibits in other classes
 to be the work of the exhibitor. Any exhibitor who is disqualified for showing produce not of
 his/her own growing to forfeit any prize money and to be barred from entering future Shows.
 The committee reserves the right to inspect the garden or allotment of intending Exhibitors
 before or after the Show.
- All floral arrangements in the Floral Art Section must be carried out at the Show venue by the exhibitor.
- 3. All exhibits in Handicrafts, Baking, Wine/Cordial, Preserves, Children's must have been made by the exhibitor.
- 4. Any prize may at the discretion of the Judge be withheld or modified if the Exhibit is considered unworthy of the prize offered. Provided there are at least 7 entries in a Class, a "Highly Commended" Certificate may be awarded by the Judge to any non-prize-winning entry(ies) in the Class. The minimum number of entries proviso will not apply to Children's Classes.
- 5. Maximum number of entries per person per class is FIVE (5).
- 6. The Show Secretary can move entries into more appropriate classes at their discretion.
- All plates for Vegetable entries (except Top Tray) are to be provided by CHS. Vases will be
 provided by CHS and any others may not be used except when own container is stated. Paper
 plates and doilies will be provided for the Baking section.
- 8. Photographs are to be submitted digitally only.
- Objections to be laid with at least 2 members of the CHS Committee, inc Show Secretary before 4.30pm on the Show Day.
- 10. Exhibits must not be removed until trophies and awards have been presented. Normally 4.30pm.
- 11. Exhibits in vegetable, flowers, fruit, baking, preserves and honey not bearing a coloured dot and not claimed by 4.30pm will be included in the charity sale at the close of the Show.
- 12. Dots are not required for Pot Plants, Handicrafts, Children's, Wine, Floral Art or Art and these items will not be sold but dots are advised to avoid confusion when the produce is sold off.
- 13. Staging must be complete by 9.45am on Saturday but discretion may be given for floral arrangements which must be completed by 11.00am prior to the arrival of the Judge.
- 14. The Exhibit number must be affixed to each Entry before Judging commences and must be clearly visible. Separate arrangements can be made for Art exhibits by agreement.
- 15. Entry fees must be paid at time of entry.
- 16. Floral Art Classes to be judged in accordance with N.A.F.A.S. Handbook of Schedule Definitions.
- 17. The CHS Committee accepts no responsibility for the loss of, or damage to exhibits, though every reasonable care will be taken and the making of an entry indicates acceptance of these rules. The ruling of the CHS Committee shall be final on any point not covered by these rules.
- 18. THE JUDGES' DECISION IS FINAL

ENTRY DETAILS

All sections are open. Membership of CHS is not a requirement in any class, but we encourage you to join our Society. Entries are to be made on the form within this schedule. Please copy if you need more. Entry Forms will be accepted at Calverley Methodist Church Hall, Chapel Street, Calverley as follows:

Friday 23rd August 6.00pm - 9.00pm Saturday 24th August 8.30am - 9.30am

Entries are discouraged on Saturday due to staging and judging requirements and are made at the discretion of the Show Secretary. Entries can be made by special arrangement in advance by notifying the Show Secretary by phone, in writing or by email (bev.smith64@gmail.com) from 12th August. **Staging** of exhibits can take place on Friday between 6.00pm and 9.00pm and Saturday between 8.30am and 9.45am. After that the Hall needs to be cleared to allow judging to take place and no entries can be received or staged.

EXHIBITOR NUMBER: This will be added to your form by the Show Team when you make your entries.

Minimum of 10 points required to receive awards/cups/trophies marked *. In the event of a tie, the Trophy will go to person with the most 1st Prizes. Trophies will be awarded on Show Day but must be left with the Show Secretary to be engraved (as appropriate). Trophies are to be kept safe by the recipient and insured by the recipient. CLASSES:

VEGETABLE & FRUIT

Paper Plates provided for exhibits

1 TOP TRAY CLASS

This class is for **THREE** types of vegetables chosen from the following list, with the required quantity of each chosen veg in brackets: - Cauliflowers (2) Onions (seed or set) (3) Parsnips (3) Potatoes (3) Peas with some stalk (6) Runner or French Beans with some stalk (6) Tomatoes with Calyces (6) Carrots (3) Sweet corn (2) Pepper (3) Cucumber (2) Courgettes (3) Red beet (3) Aubergines (2). For carrots and parsnips, the top foliage should be trimmed to not more than 3" (7.5cm) from the top of the shoulder of the vegetable. Onion tops may be tied. All veg must be displayed within the confines of an area 18" x 24" (46x60cm): a plain or painted tray or a black cloth or board of this size may be used by the exhibitor on which to display the vegetables. Parsley is allowed as the only garnishing material.

- 3 Six pods Kidney (French) beans
- 4 Six pods Runner Beans
- 5 Longest Runner Bean
- 6 Dish of three Beetroot any variety tops trimmed
- 7 One White Cabbage to be cut 1.5 lbs (700g) minimum
- 8 One Cabbage as grown 1.5" (3.8 cm) roots to remain
- 9 One Cauliflower
- 10 Carrots three of a kind any variety tops trimmed to not more than 3" (7.5cm)
- 11 Three Courgettes
- 12 One Cucumber
- 13 One each of three different vegetables, one red (not turnip), one green and one yellow or orange
- 14 Calverley Allotment Trug Trug/Basket (max 45cmx30cm) for Calverley Allotment Holders **minimum of 6 (SIX)** different items (fruit or vegetables) from your plot arranged with optional herbs or flowers as garnish only
- 15 One Squash any variety 12" (30 cm) maximum (length or diameter)
- 16 Heaviest Marrow
- 17 Six Shallots from sets dressed no roots
- 18 Three Onions from sets dressed no roots
- 19 Six pods Peas
- 20 Four Coloured Potatoes
- 21 Four White Potatoes
- 22 Six Cherry Tomatoes
- 23 Three stems of rhubarb, tops trimmed to 3" (7.5cm) approximately
- 24 Dish of four Tomatoes
- 25 Two Parsnips
- 26 One each of four different vegetables
- 27 Any vegetable not separately classified
- 28 Four Apples Culinary
- 29 Four Apples Dessert
- 30 Any Fruit not separately classified

FLOWERS

31 TOP VASE CLASS

For a vase of mixed flowers of between five and ten stems taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants. Please note that two varieties of the same flower are NOT two kinds. The Vase will be viewed from all directions and must be in proportion to the display which will be judged out of a total of 35 points: 10 for presentation and 25 for colour, form, condition, quality and freshness. NO accessories, seed heads, berries or foliage (other than attached to flowering stems) are allowed. Own container and packing material is permitted.

- 32 Vase of Mixed Annuals arranged to be viewed from the front. (Antirrhinums may be classed as annuals)
- 33 Three's company one of each of three different flowers
- 34 Vase of six Asters (singles or doubles)
- 35 One Sunflower any variety
- 36 Pot Grown Orchid in bloom
- 37 Vase of three Medium Flowered Cactus and/or Semi-Cactus Dahlias (named)
- 38 Vase of three Giant or Large Decorative Dahlias (named)
- 39 Vase of three Small Flowered Dahlias (named)
- 40 Vase of Mixed Dahlias
- 41 Vase of three Medium Flowered Decorative Dahlias (named)
- 42 Vase of Mixed Flowers arranged to be viewed from the front
- 43 Six Pansies or Violas (own board or container)
- 44 Vase of Hardy Herbaceous Perennials (Rose and Gladioli barred)
- 45 Pot Plant in bloom excluding Orchids, Pelargoniums and Fuchsias
- 46 Pot Plant in foliage
- 48 Vase of three spikes of (perennial) Phlox
- 49 One stem of Cluster Flowered (Floribunda) Rose
- 50 Vase of three Gladioli
- 51 Vase of six spikes of Sweet Peas
- 52 Gentleman's Buttonhole
- 53 Potted Pelargonium (Geranium) in maximum 6" (15cm) pot
- 54 Potted Fuchsia in maximum 6" (15cm) pot
- 55 Vase of three Stems of Spray Chrysanthemums (named)
- 56 One flower plus one vegetable
- 57 Single Stem any flower except Sunflower, Dahlia or Gladiolus, can include single Specimen Rose
- 58 One Cactus or Succulent
- $59 \ Any \ Garden \ Flower-6 cm-10 cm \ cut \ to \ display \ floating \ in \ a \ wine \ glass \ (exhibitor's \ own \ glass)$
- *no class 47

BAKING

Entries to be displayed on a plate with a doily except in class 74. Doilies provided.

- 60 One Shortbread Round using 6oz plain flour, 4oz butter, 2oz sugar
- 62 Four Cup Cakes
- 63 One Apple Pie
- 64 One cake containing a stated vegetable ingredient e.g. Carrot (undecorated)
- 65 One Lemon Cake (can be "Drizzle")
- 66 One handmade loaf of bread any recipe (not machine made)
- 67 Six Fruit Scones
- *no class 61

68 Yorkshire Fruit Loaf – to the following recipe:

8 ozs (225g) SR Flour, 1/8th tsp Salt, 4ozs (110g) Sugar, 4ozs (110g) Margarine, 1 Egg, 4ozs (110g) Currants, 4ozs (110g) Sultanas 2 ozs (55g) Mixed Peel, 1/8th pint (70ml) Milk, ¼ tsp Bicarbonate of Soda (metric weights approx.)

Method: Sieve flour and salt, rub in margarine. Stir in sugar and fruit, beat egg and stir into dry ingredients. Dissolve bicarbonate of soda in a little milk, and then add enough milk to make a soft dropping consistency. Bake in a loaf tin in moderate oven until golden brown.

74 The Calverley Show Stopper - a decorated (all edible decorations) sponge/fruit cake inspired by **ALICE IN WONDERLAND** – size: width30cm x length30cm x height60cm, presented on own base.

WINE/FRUIT SPIRIT

Classes 75-77 should not be made from a "kit", but from own produce. Fruit should be named.

75 One bottle of fruit spirit (eg: from a base of Gin, Brandy, Vodka - named)

76 One bottle of White Wine

77 One bottle of Red Wine

PRESERVES

Classes 78-82 - jars should be filled to the neck. Contents should ideally be covered with a wax circle. Use of cellophane covers secured with a rubber band or screw lid permitted.

78 One jar of Pickles, Piccalilli or Chutney

79 One Jar of Strawberry Jam

80 One jar of Jam (any fruit except Strawberry)

81 One jar of Marmalade

82 One jar of Lemon Cheese or Curd

HONEY

83 One jar of light honey

84 One jar of dark honey

HANDICRAFTS

Judge is looking for technical expertise, originality of design and the use of colour and texture. The amount of time and effort expended are also assessed. A set of articles is acceptable as a single entry.

85 Any hand knitted Garment (can be gloves, hat, scarf, shawl)

86 Any hand embroidered article including Cross-stitch

87 Any crochet-ed item

88 Any Handmade Soft Toy

89 Any hand sewn garment (sewing machine can be used)

90 Any other Handmade Article/Novelty

FLORAL ART

(Accessories allowed in all classes)
